

The 2019 Plan NH Scholarship and Fellowship Program

Plan NH's **Scholarship and Fellowship Program** recognizes and honors outstanding students (undergraduate and graduate) who call New Hampshire home and who are studying a field related to our mission: to “foster excellence in planning, design and development of New Hampshire’s built environment.”

Studies may include, but not necessarily be limited to:

- Architecture
- Landscape Architecture
- Studio Art
- Engineering
- Interior Design
- a construction-related field or trade
- Environmental science or similar field
- Land or community planning
- Historic preservation

In partnership with the NH Charitable Foundation, Plan NH finances these scholarships and fellowships from NH-based funds that were created for the purpose of encouraging and supporting students interested in some aspect of the built environment and its impact on the social, economic, and/or environmental capital of a community.

Criteria/Qualifications

- College (must be at least in first year when applying) or Grad School in an accredited program
- Superior grade point average with a demonstrated general excellence in field of study
- Also
 - “activist” orientation showing excellent potential for having a positive effect on the *built environment* of northern New England
 - Demonstrated dedication to a life’s work in a chosen field
 - Leadership experience and ability to communicate and promote solutions
 - Breadth of skills, including flexibility and creativity required to work with diverse interest groups
 - Work experience in a related or relevant field
 - A New England focus that will most likely lead to application of the candidate’s skills and training to solving problems of the built environment in New Hampshire or Northern New England.

Applications are due April 12, 2019 electronically, in PDF format. There is a \$10 fee to apply – this to be sent separately to the PO Box listed. Applications will be reviewed by a committee of diverse professionals, and those selected for interviews will be notified. Where applicable, the applicant may be asked to bring a portfolio of her or his work.

Finalists will be notified and invited to be part of Plan NH’s annual Awards Dinner in June (date and location tbd).
